We have a clear vision where we strive to 'Inspire Everyone to Live Creative Lives' and this is central to all aspects of work at Calderdale Music Trust. The advertised positions are at present term time only (working 38 weeks a year) and Calderdale Music Trust are open to job share applications.

The pay scales for these posts are

Music Leader (Whole Class Ensemble and School Curriculum) T11 (£22,930) to T20 (£33,121)

and includes time for planning, preparation and assessment, staff training, travel time and holiday pay. Some Calderdale Music Trust delivery takes place on an evening, Saturday morning and there is the potential for out of term time opportunities. There would be some expectation that the post holder would be willing to work some hours during these times.



<u>About Us</u>

Calderdale Music Trust was established in May 2015. Since our launch in 2015, the Trust has successfully grown to now include 11 Music Leaders, an efficient Administration Team and a Senior Leadership Team that comprises the Business Manager, Assistant Principal and Principal.

Our stakeholders include schools and academies across Calderdale in both primary and secondary phases and the Special Educational Need and Disability (SEND) sector. We also serve families and individuals independently, providing tuition in music or singing to suit their requirements. We have established strong partnerships with a variety of organisations including the Local Authority.

Calderdale Music Trust provides an increasing range of opportunities for children and young people to make music in ensembles from beginner standard through to high levels. From September 2021, Calderdale Music Trust will move into flagship premises at The Old Courthouse in Halifax and will include a small Concert Hall, ensembles rooms, 1:1 teaching rooms, full suite of iMac computers with MIDI keyboards, a small music shop and coffee shop.

We also support the important ensemble work that goes on in schools including: guitar ensembles; junior/senior bands and orchestra groups; recorder groups; rock/soul and funk bands; theatre groups; pop groups; and senior and junior choirs.

We hold a number of events throughout the year encouraging schools and individuals alike to join in and enjoy the fun of both making, and appreciating, music. We are also involved in organising conferences and tours and our aim is to widen participation in musicality across the Calderdale community in its entirety.

As a Trust we have a Board of eight Trustees, which includes the Principal. These individuals bring a wealth of knowledge and enthusiasm and they are fundamental to the success of the Trust. The Trust receives funding from the Arts Council, schools and parental fees, in addition to some smaller scale grants.

Our services are also extended to adult learners, whom we welcome at lessons and adult ensembles.

Whole Class Ensemble and School Curriculum Teaching

This is a flexible and diverse opportunity where provision will be at least a term but in most cases a year. Whole class teaching is delivered by Calderdale Music Trust or commissioned by schools. This offer requires a well-planned and progressive experience with high expectations and impact.

Calderdale Singing Initiative

Calderdale Music Trust is committed to giving every young person the opportunity to access a high quality singing provision. We firmly believe singing promotes teamwork, self-confidence and improved thinking skills with links to literacy, numeracy and many more subject areas.

Workshops and celebrations

Calderdale Music Trust supplies schools with full day or half day workshops in a range of exciting musical activities including singing days and samba sessions.

Ensembles

Prior to COVID-19, we ran a variety of ensembles every week at the Halifax Music Centre, Heath Training and Development Centre, Halifax. This is one our core roles from the Arts Council and is an area that we are keen to develop further at The Old Courthouse.

Instrumental tuition

Calderdale Music Trust offer high motivated, effective and supportive instrumental tutors and specialist group/individual tuition on the following: Strings, Piano, Woodwind, Guitar, Brass, Keyboard, Singing and Percussion.
